E. Reports from DAC Representatives

- 1. Board of Education Meeting Update Cindy Goldberg
 - There have been two Board Meeting since our last DAC meeting.
 - A presentation of the LCAP Goals was given.
 - Dr. Connelly spoke about the Guided Pathway project meeting. Students learned what career options exist and what pathways might best serve their needs in choosing a college or major.
 - Mrs. Everett spoke about being grateful to Newbury Park High School's English Department for their openness in meeting with her and discussing the Core Literature Policy and syllabus procedures.

- During the Instructional Services Information Items it was asked if CVUSD can
 do everything well. With teaching there was a resounding yes, but not with the
 core business of the District. The core business is being reworked, it is believed
 that we need to improve the business of education. We will soon see a retoolec
 budget and recording process.
- On January 29, 2018 there was a Board Planning session that took place at the Library.
- There was a great deal of interest in the February 6, 2018 board meeting and the attendance was high. This was the first ticketed event for CVUSD School Board Meeting. Mr. Dunn was absent.
- 27 speakers spoke and 26 of the speakers spoke on the incident relating to a school board member's behavior.
- There was a vote on Parent Engagement Plan for Title I schools. Mrs. Phelps expressed her disappointment that the plans were uniform and there were very few unique plans for each school's culture incorporated into their plan and that would have been more effective and meaningful.
- There was a vote to censure Mr. Dunn and it passed unanimously 4-0.
- Presentation by Mr. Hayek on the new LCAP budget process. The budget process will first assess the needs and then move through the goals and make an action plan that aligns resources with the goals and the need to make the best decisions for our students.

- 4. Conejo Valley Pupil Personnel Association (CVPPA) Susan Wilson
 - Counselors for grades K-12 do a great deal to directly support a number of the CVUSD LCAP goals. Below are some examples of the support we provide:
 - Goal 2C: Secondary counselors support social/emotional interventions by providing peer mentor groups, new to school groups, peer mediation programs, coordinating speakers for both student and parents, and by providing individual and small group counseling. Elementary Counselors provide group and individual counseling to provide emotional, academic, and social skills to all students in grades TK-5.
 - Goal 2D: The high schools have liaisons and coordinators that work with special populations including ELD and Special Education, as well as homeless and foster youth. Secondary counselors support students in a variety of intervention programs including: peer tutoring, coordinating volunteer high school students to tutor middle school students, making presentations to parents of at-risk students, creating tutor lists for students to support their peers academically, placing students in appropriate support classes and meeting in small groups and individually with at risk students. Elementary counselors give school wide classroom presentations/assemblies on such issues as conflict resolution and inclusion.
 - o Goal 3: Secondary counselors support and guide students toward participation in clubs, music, sports, and a wide variety of campus activities. In addition, the high school counselors support the AVID program to help students achieve their own potential. Elementary counselors work with all 5th grade classes monthly/semimonthly to provide the STAND PROUD leadership program. They also participate in developing the district wide anti-bullying campaign in the elementary schools.
