Armatus Sexual Molestation Prevention Program

What is the Armatus Program?

The Armatus Program teaches you how to raise awareness regarding the compelling issue of Sexual Molestation in our schools today. In addition, it teaches you how to protect yourself from false allegations of abuse.

How does it work?

The program is internet-based, so you can access it anytime from anywhere. You just logon to a high-speed Internet connection to complete your courses. The average time of completion for each of the four modules is 20 to 30 minutes. Each course ends with a brief quiz to ensure you understand all of this important information. You will be given time at work or as part of staff development to complete this program. It can be accessed from any on-line computer. Your supervisor will give you the timeframe to have this training completed.

What will I see and learn?

The step-by-step courses are fun to watch and easy to understand. You will see four (4) different courses. Complete each course from beginning to end. If you stop a course before you finish it, you'll have to start over at the beginning. Some employees have already completed the first three modules; they need only to complete the fourth one, VUSD Procedures.

Meet Sam - Sam molests children, and in this module he tells you how he gets away with it. You learn the types of molesters and the methods they use to manipulate their coworkers, parents, and children—all to meet their own needs. You also learn how to spot interactions between adults and children that may indicate danger.

It Happened to Me - Temper outbursts. Failing grades. Depression. Suicide. These are just a few of the effects of sexual abuse. In this module, you hear children and adults describe the devastating effects abuse had on their lives. You learn about the prevalence of abuse and specific characteristics that may put some children at higher risk of abuse.

Keeping your School Safe - This module shows you where and when abuse is more likely to occur in your schools, and the specific steps you can take to keep children safe. You also learn how to keep yourself and your coworkers safe from false allegations of abuse.

Your Procedures - You must know CVUSD Procedures relevant to the prevention of abuse. To complete the module, you must indicate on-line that you have read, understood, and agree to comply with the procedures.

How do I logon?

Logon to a high-speed Internet connections and go to: www.Praesidiuminc.com. Click on *Armatus Training NEW!* on the left-hand navigation menu. Select *Click here to begin Armatus Online Training* (login required). Enter your login and password and click submit (See below). Choose your course and click the title to begin.

What is my login and password?

Your login is the **first letter of your first name and full last name** (example: John R. Smith = **jsmith**). You must use lowercase keys. Your password is the **last 4 numbers of your PSL number listed on your pay warrant stub followed by the letters "ca"** (example: **1234ca**). Please see the example below.
