

**RESOLUTION #23/24-28**  
**IN SUPPORT OF**  
**ASIAN AMERICAN and PACIFIC ISLANDER HERITAGE MONTH**

**WHEREAS**, in 1990, President George H. W. Bush signed a bill passed by Congress to extend the week-long celebration to a month-long one. In 1992, the official designation of May as Asian American and Pacific Islander Heritage Month was signed into law; and

**WHEREAS**, recognizing the significance of Asian-American and Pacific Islander Heritage Month as a time to celebrate the significant contributions of Asian-Americans and Pacific Islanders to the history of the United States; and

**WHEREAS**, annually in May, Asian American and Pacific Islander Heritage Month is celebrated in America to honor the accomplishments of Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders (AAPI) and their contributions to the Federal Government, United States Armed Forces, American history, culture, education, medicine, and society; and

**WHEREAS**, the Asian-American and Pacific Islander community is an inherently diverse population, composed of more than 45 distinct ethnicities and more than 100 language dialects; and


**WHEREAS**, celebrating Asian-Americans and Pacific Islanders provides an opportunity for the people of our community to recognize the achievements, contributions, and history of, and to understand the challenges faced by Asian-Americans and Pacific Islanders; and

**WHEREAS**, Conejo Valley Unified School District reaffirms our commitment to combating the racism and discrimination against Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders in our schools, our community, and our Nation; and encourages educators, students, and families to honor and respect Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders, and learn about their heritage and achievements through appropriate programs and activities; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Governing Board of the Conejo Valley Unified School District recognizes May 2024 as Asian American and Pacific Islander Heritage Month.
